Plant Variety	Seeds	Plants	Description
Sweet Peppers			
Alma Paprika			Cherry type pepper. A sweet, prolific pepper that can be eaten fresh, pickled or dried.
Red Sweet Cherry			Produces thick-walled, large, sweet cherry peppers.
Red Shepherd			A nice alternative to bell peppers.
California Wonder			An excellent sweet green bell pepper.
Chocolate Bell Pepper			A chocolate coloured bell pepper with a very sweet flavour.
Red Bell Pepper			Produces good sized, red, bell shaped peppers on strong plants.
Hot Peppers			
Czeck Black			Pepper bears 2-3" size fruit that ripen from black to a rich red. Slightly less hot than a Jalapenos.
Cayenne Blend			This brightly coloured blend of golden, red, orange, purple and green mildly hot peppers will make your dishes an eye-catching treat.

Heirloom Bolivian Rainbow		Produces beautiful coloured peppers early and all through the season.
Jalapeno		Easy to grow. Suitable for container gardening.
Yatsufusa (Yatzy)		Yatsufusa is a hot specialty pepper that originated in Japan and is also known as “chilies Japonés”
