





Tomato Seeds and Plants - 2024

Tomato Variety	Seeds	Plants	Description
<b>Abe Lincoln</b>			A good disease resistant tomato. Delicious, rich, slightly acidic tomato flavors. Produces extra large 1 lb heirloom tomatoes. These tomatoes turn dark red as they mature.
<b>African Togo</b>			A rare heirloom from the Togolese Republic in West Africa. Produces loads of pink ruffled fruit.
<b>Amethyst Cream Cherry</b>			Mid-season. One of the prettiest cherry tomatoes - sweet, fruity, with purple blushed tops and cream-white undersides. A fairly low acid fruit with very good production.
<b>Apricot</b>			Early to mid-season. Prolific producer of small to medium-sized yellow fruits that blush as they ripen. Slightly fuzzy skin is similar to the popular Garden Peach tomato with the same sweet flavour – a good salad tomato.
<b>Beefsteak</b>			Late. Popular old variety which is very large, deep red with fine rich flavour.
<b>Black Cherry (CO)</b>			Early to mid-season. Rare, true cherry tomato with black skin. Deep red flesh with blackish hues. Flavour is sweet and deep.
<b>Black from Tula</b>			Mid-season. A rare Russian heirloom with deep purplish-brown colour and deep, rich flavour. Fruits are 8-12 oz.
<b>Black Krim</b>			Late. Dark-coloured, thin-skinned, meaty fruits are incredibly juicy and can grow up to 1.5 lb. , under semi-drought conditions. The slightly smoky, salty flavour is great for salads or eaten straight off the vine. Heavy producer.
<b>Black Prince</b>			Mid-season. Medium-size, dark red to brown in colour, round to oblong shape, great rich old-fashioned flavour and excellent yield. Said to be from Siberia. Resists cracking.
<b>Brandywine Red (CO)</b>			Late. One of the most famous heirlooms (1885, Amish), the winner of many taste tests with bright tangy flavour. Large beefsteak type, up to 2 lb., ideal for slices, salads and

			sandwiches. Not a heavy producer. Long vines and potato-leaf foliage.
<b>Bull's Heart</b>	✓	✓	Bull's Heart is a prolific indeterminate beefsteak-size tomato-leaf plant with pink-red, heart-shaped fruit, used mainly for canning and slicing.
<b>Bread and Salt</b>	✓	✓	This delectable, meaty, oxheart type is an heirloom from Russia. The fruit is a large with dense, meaty flesh. It is perfect for slicing, sauce making and almost anything.
<b>Burbank</b>	✓	✓	Tomato-leaf plant with medium-sized deep garnet red to dark purple perfectly round fruit. Small plants.
<b>Cherokee Purple</b>	✓	✓	Late. Unique dusty rose colour with a sweet, smoky flavour that rivals Brandywine. Productive plants, heavy crops of 12 oz. fruits, good in dry conditions. Indeterminate.
<b>China Orange</b>	✓	⊗	Super rare Chinese organic tomato. Determinant plants growing only 3.5 feet high, produce round bright orange fruits weighing 6-8 oz with a sweet and creamy taste.
<b>Dattletomate</b>	✓	⊗	Indeterminate regular leaf plant, small, paste-type tomatoes <b>growing in clusters.</b>
<b>Druzhba</b>	✓	✓	Tomato- leaf plant with medium-sized deep red, round fruit. Hardy.
<b>Galinas</b>	✓	⊗	Early. Delightful and delicious sweet yellow cherry from Siberia on medium-length vines that produce heavy clusters of fruit until heavy frost.
<b>Green Zebra</b>	✓	✓	Late. Yellow and green 2' fruits with dark green vertical stripes. Emerald green flesh is juicy, sweet and mild.
<b>Green Tomatillo</b>	✓	⊗	The <b>tomatillo</b> also known as the Mexican husk tomato.

<b>Hotset</b>	✓	✓	Tomato- leaf plant with medium-sized red, round fruit. Productive.
<b>Indigo Rose</b>	✓	✓	Unique, purple-red with the red interior.
<b>Moneymaker</b>	✓	⊗	Mid-season. An old English heirloom; greenhouse variety; produces 4-6 oz globes that are intensely red, smooth and of very high quality. Grows well in hot humid climates and sets in most any weather. Flavourful but becoming rare.
<b>Moskvitch</b>	✓	⊗	Early. Siberian origin. 4" bright, red fruits are round to flat with tasty flavour. Good producer, good keeper.
<b>Old Brook</b>	⊗	⊗	One of the earliest full-sized tomatoes. Large 1 lb. Fruit is delicious and juicy, well-suited to home canning due to its high acidity. Resistant to blossom end rot and blight. Long vines.
<b>Old German</b>	✓	✓	Mid-season. A beautiful large multi-coloured yellow/orange/crimson tomato with good production.
<b>Paul Robeson</b>	⊗	⊗	A Russian heirloom, beefsteak-type tomato.
<b>Pineapple</b>	✓	✓	Late. Large yellow beefsteak-sized tomatoes with red streaks on blossom end. Sweet, bright flavour.
<b>Polish</b>	✓	⊗	Mid-season. The 3-5 ft heavy plant is loaded with beefsteak-type pinkish fruit, weighing up to 1 lb. Very productive, potato-leaf.
<b>Red Pear</b>	✓	✓	Late. Another very old variety, known since the early 1800s. Fruits are flavourful, red, pear-shaped, small and popular for gourmet salads. Productive with long, rambling 6 ft. vines.

<b>Red Zebra</b>			Mid-season. Fire engine red 2' fruits are covered with bright yellow stripes. Sweet and flavourful, this variety is very popular with home and specialty markets.
<b>Reisetomate</b>			Also called “Traveler Tomato” (“reise” is German for “travel” or “journey”) for the ability to tear it apart a piece at a time, with no need for a knife. This type of tomato traces its roots to Central America where the native people would carry traveler tomatoes on trips, to eat as they walked.
<b>Roma</b>			The best known of the paste-types can also be used for sauces and catsup. Disease resistant. Determinate variety. No staking required.
<b>Russian</b>			Mid-season. Very meaty, large red oxheart or paste-type fruits with mild, sweet flavour and few seeds.
<b>San Marzano</b>			Plum tomato variety.
<b>Sunrise Bumblebee</b>			Indeterminate. Sunrise Bumblebee is a beautiful little cherry tomato with big flavour!
<b>Tiny Tim Cherry Tomato</b>			Extremely early, miniature cherry tomato. Deep well-drained soil is best. Perfect for decorating salads and vegetable trays.
<b>Yellow Pear Tomato</b>			A superb miniature pear-shaped yellow tomato with a delightful sweet flavour. Mid-early ripeness until frost. Indeterminate. Staking required. Excellent in salads and great for vegetables trays.
<b>Vintage Wine</b>			Mid-season to late. Plant produces good yields of 1-2.5 lb. Bi-coloured pink beefsteak tomatoes with golden stripes. They are mildly sweet and flavourful. Perfect for salads, slicing, and sandwiches. A potato-leaf variety. Excellent choice for home gardens and specialty market growers.
